Part-Time Web Developer Position

Professors Raj Chetty, John N. Friedman, and Nathaniel Hendren



We are looking to hire a part-time web developer to work with our research group on the [Equality of Opportunity Project](#). The overarching mission of the project is to understand the key determinants of intergenerational mobility and thereby develop policies that empower low-income families to rise out of poverty. Current projects study the long-term impacts of [neighborhoods](#), the role of [colleges](#) as a pathway to upward mobility, the relationship between [income and life expectancy](#), the determinants of innovation and entrepreneurship, and how social networks may affect poverty. The research uses “big data” and quasi-experimental methods to identify causal effects and test the predictions of economic and sociological models. Recent results from these projects have appeared in the [New York Times](#) and have been cited in the President's State of the Union address.

This role will involve building interactive graphics that allow data from our recent studies to be explored in a web browser. Applicants should be proficient in HTML and JavaScript. Familiarity with the D3JS library is strongly preferred, though not required.
